COVID-19 Response Guide

The purpose of this guide is to help decision making and eliminate any uncertainty as to what action the school requires and parents should do when faced with the varied and different situations that can occur related to COVID-19.

The school's priority is to keep the school staff and students safe and healthy. As instructed by the Ministry of Education (MoE), the school will not share any details of cases or personal information of families. The Ministry of Health (MoH) will determine all requirements for quarantine and testing.

What happens	What you do
If you, your child or someone who lives with you has any of the following symptoms: • Cough • Shortness of breath • Difficulty Breathing • Sudden loss of smell • Sudden loss of taste • Fever • Chills • Myalgia (muscle ache/pain) • Headache • Sore Throat • Nausea or Vomiting • Diarrhea • Fatigue • Acute onset nasal congestion or running nose	 Do not bring any of your children to school until they are free of symptoms. Notify the Principal that your child is home sick. This may include seeking further advice from a doctor. If visiting a doctor, update the Principal on diagnosis. A medical certificate may be required to return to school Agree on a return date with the Principal.

What happens	What you do
If you, your child, or someone who lives with you tests positive for COVID-19.	 Do not bring any of your children to school. Notify the Principal. Students must stay home for 14 days after the onset of symptoms or positive COVID tests. Follow any MOH guidelines. Provide a negative test result before returning to school. In consultation with the parents, the school will decide when it is safe to return.

What happens	What you do
If you, your child or someone who lives with you has been in close (direct) contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.	 Do not bring any of your children to school. Notify the Principal. Allow a minimum of 2 days for information gathering and contact tracing to take place. In consultation with the parents, the school will decide when it is safe to return.
